- **Apple varieties**

Anna, Beverly Hills, Dorsett Golden, Einshemer, Fuji, Gala, Gordon, Tropical Beauty

- **Pear varieties**

Baldwin, Florida Home, Fan Stil, Hood, Kieffer, Orient, Pineapple

- **Plum varieties**

Beauty, Burgundy, Howard Miracle, Kelsey, Mariposa, Methley, Santa Rosa, Satsuma, Sprite

What Trees Do Well Here

- **Stone Fruit varieties**

- Apricots – Goldkist, Katy, Early Golden, Newcastle (400 chill hours)

- Peaches – August Pride, Babcock, Bonita, Desertgold, Early Amber, Earligrande, FlordaPrince, Midpride, Red Baron, Tropi-berta, Eva's Pride, Tropic Snow (500 chill hours)

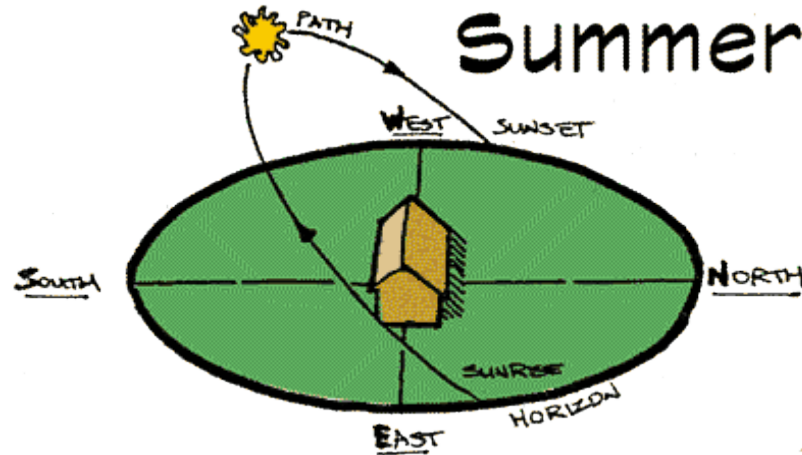


Identifying site for sun, irrigation needs and growth

Dig hole as wide and deep as root ball



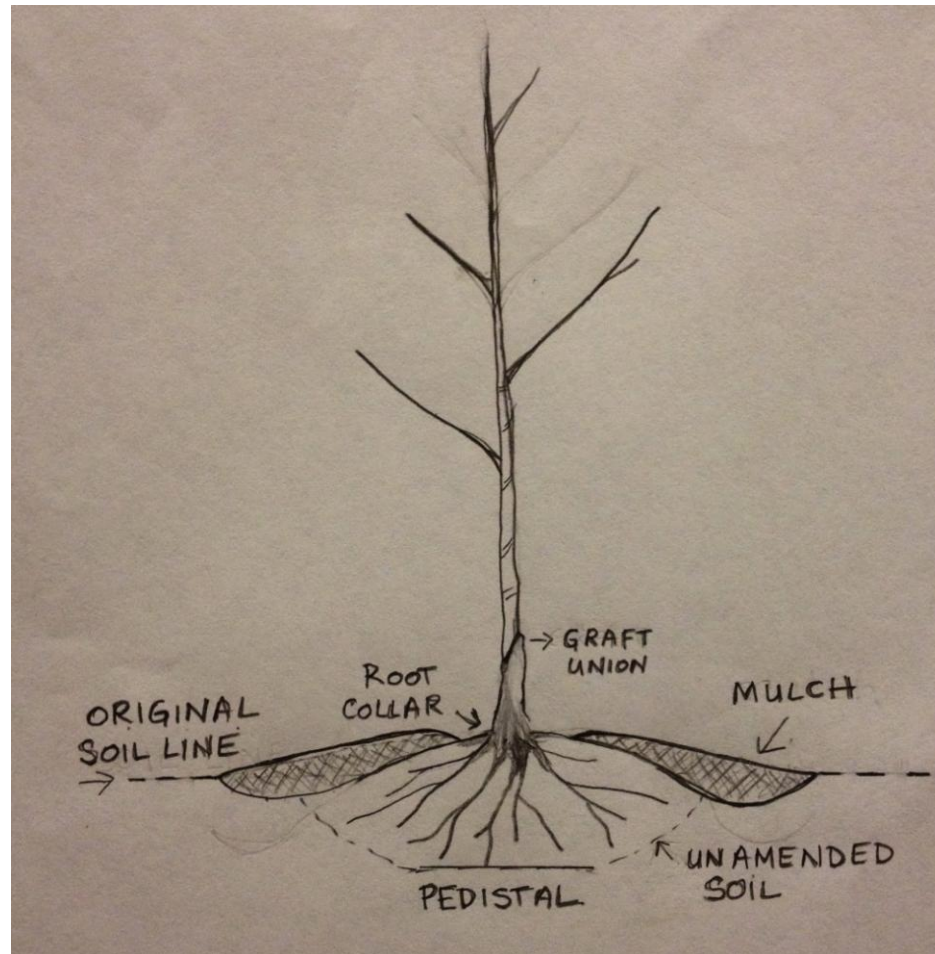
Backfill with unamended soil
